How to Attend

Want to pursue a community and technical college education? Follow the steps below to get started!

- **1. Complete an application**. All community and technical colleges in West Virginia practice an open admissions policy, which means all students with a high school diploma or Test Assessing Secondary Completion (TASC) will be admitted, but you still need to apply.
- 2. File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, or FAFSA. This is the application required by the Federal Government for students to receive federal student aid, such as the Federal Pell Grant and student loans, to attend college.

 File for free at FAFSA.gov.
- 3. Send your high school/college transcripts to the college you want to attend. The college you wish to attend will need to have your transcripts on file.
- 4. Speak with an admissions representative at the college you want to attend. They can let you know of any college-specific requirements you need to fulfill before enrolling in classes.
- 5. Speak with a financial aid representative at the college you want to attend. They can confirm that your FAFSA came through successfully. You will also receive an award letter from the school to show you how much financial aid you are eligible to receive.



You may be eligible for the West Virginia Invests Grant, a financial aid program designed to cover the cost of tuition and fees for certificate or associate degree programs in high-demand fields at participating West Virginia public institutions.

Employer Partnerships & Programs



The West Virginia Community and Technical College System offers grants and programs that link companies with colleges. Whether it's customized training, skill enhancements, certificate or associate degree programs, if a company needs education or training to get a skilled workforce – West Virginia's community and technical colleges are prepared to deliver.

LEARN & EARN

Would you like your employees to have on-the-job training while earning their degree?

This grant program connects employers with Community and Technical College students, allowing students to take technical courses while gaining paid cooperative work experiences as they complete their degree or training program. The student pay is shared by the company and the college, and students receive a minimum of \$15 per hour to work in the field they are studying in. In addition, this program allows the employers to gain a pipeline of qualified employees trained with the knowledge and skills needed to succeed in West Virginia's workforce.

Program Highlights:

- Students gain valuable paid work experience in their field of study.
- Work experiences are coupled and aligned with in-class instruction.
- The grant reimburses employeres for 50 percent of the student's wages.
- Students earn a minimum of \$15 per hour.



RAPID RESPONSE ADVANCE GRANT

Are you trying to fill an immediate training need?

This grant is awarded to colleges to partner with businesses and industries on projects that address the state's workforce needs – including pre-employment programs, pre-preparation programs, skills upgrades, new and expanding companies, and job retention.

TECHNICAL PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

Do you need a community and technical college to develop an academic program?

This grant program supports the design, development, and implementation of new academic or technical degree programs that are in high demand and that lead to high-wage careers. The new degree program must lead to a Certificate of Applied Science or an Associate degree. Eligible programs must target high-demand occupations that will result in wages averaging at least \$15 per hour with benefits.
