**MINUTES**  
**WEST VIRGINIA COUNCIL FOR**  
**COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGE EDUCATION**

**April 24, 2025**

A meeting of the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education was held via Zoom beginning at 9:30 am. Council members present were: William Baker, Robert Brown, Clinton Burch, Michael Graney, Sandra Hamilton, Elizabeth Manuel, Tracy Miller, Joseph Oliverio, Andrew Payne, and Steve Roberts. Absent were: Christina Cameron and Traci Nelson. Also in attendance were Council staff, community and technical college presidents, faculty, staff, and guests.

**Call to Order**

In Chairman Christina Cameron's absence, Vice Chairman Steve Roberts served as Chairman and called the meeting to order noting a quorum was present.

**1. Approval of Minutes**

Mr. Baker moved the adoption of the minutes from the January 16, 2025, March 3, 2025, and April 7, 2025, meetings of the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education.

Ms. Miller seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**2. Annual Reauthorization of Two-year Degree-Granting Institutions**

Mr. Brown moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLVED, That the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education approves annual reauthorization (through June 30, 2026) for Ameritas College, Laurel College of Technology, West Virginia Junior College (Morgantown) and West Virginia Junior College (Bridgeport/Charleston).

Ms. Hamilton seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**3. Applied Associate of Science in Nursing Degree at Med-Care Training Center, Inc**

Ms. Miller moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLVED, That the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education approves Med Care Training Center to begin offering an LPN to RN bridge associate degree program with the implementation of the Applied Associate of Science in Nursing for implementation in fall of 2025. This approval expires two years from the date of Council approval if the program is not fully implemented by that time.

Mr. Brown seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **4. Technical Program Development Grant Awards**

Mr. Oliverio moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education approves the Technical Program Development grant awards as proposed.

Mr. Baker seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **5. Appointment of Officer Nominating Committee**

In accordance with West Virginia Code §18B-2B-4, the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education is required to conduct officer elections at its final, regularly scheduled meeting of each fiscal year. Accordingly, the Council will hold officer elections during its meeting scheduled for May 29, 2025. Newly elected officers will assume their roles effective July 1, 2025, and will serve one-year terms.

Following a discussion with Chairman Christina Cameron, Vice Chairman Steve Roberts, acting on her behalf, appointed Bob Brown, Michael Graney and Tracy Miller to serve on the Officer Nominating Committee. The committee will prepare and present a slate of officer nominees for consideration at the May meeting.

#### **6. Update on Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College**

Dr. Corley Dennison, Interim President of Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College, provided an institutional update following actions taken by the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education at its emergency meeting on April 7, 2025.

Dr. Dennison acknowledged that upon his arrival, there were widespread questions regarding his role and mission at the college. He recognized the uncertainty experienced by students, faculty, and staff in recent months, and many wanted clarity about the future direction of the institution.

During his first two weeks, Dr. Dennison held multiple meetings with the President's Cabinet, participated in productive discussions with the Chairman of the Board of Governors, and addressed faculty and staff during a previously scheduled Governance Day. Additionally, he attended a regular meeting of the Board of Governors.

Dr. Dennison outlined a proposed three-phase plan to guide the institution forward:

Phase One (Now–June 30, 2025):

The immediate focus will be on ensuring a successful conclusion to the academic year, including graduation and registration for summer and fall semesters. Preparations will begin for the upcoming Higher Learning Commission (HLC) focus visit in the fall, which will primarily examine governance. A decision will also need to be made regarding the institution's leadership beyond June 30.

Phase Two (July 1, 2025–June 30, 2026):

The institution will continue to address HLC concerns, particularly those to be examined during the fall focus visit. Dr. Dennison noted that resolving these matters and establishing

a clear strategic direction will likely require the full academic year. Identifying long-term leadership for the college will also be a key priority.

Phase Three (July 1, 2026–April 2027):

This phase will center on implementing any recommendations or mandates resulting from the HLC visit. It will also involve the execution of a comprehensive strategic plan and securing permanent leadership for the institution.

## **7. West Virginia Network Services and Support Overview**

Steven White, Executive Director of West Virginia Network (WVNET), provided an overview of services provided by WVNET primarily for K-12, higher education and state agencies. Mr. White stated that operating a modern, robust and reliable network remains at the core of WVNET's mission. WVNET has upgraded from older technologies to the latest fiber and multiple-gigabyte connections. This year, WVNET is undergoing a major network upgrade that includes the replacement of networking equipment from multiple 10GB connections to 100GB. This significantly increases bandwidth capacity and improves reliability, while reducing costs. These upgrades are made possible through a Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS) grant awarded to WVNET in 2023.

Additionally, Mr. White reported that cybersecurity remains a persistent challenge for our community and technical colleges. He said that several institutions have experienced system breaches, requiring extensive support from WVNET and other external agencies to secure their systems and restore data. Recognizing the ongoing nature of this issue, WVNET is working to establish a shared Chief Information Security Officer role. This initiative aims to provide essential resources to schools that might otherwise struggle due to budget constraints.

## **8. Additional Comments/Chancellor's Report**

### **Comments from Chancellor Tucker:**

Chancellor Sarah Tucker provided an overview of the 2025 legislative session. She reported that the rules bill passed without amendments. Additionally, necessary revisions to outdated or unclear code language were approved. Chancellor Tucker noted that the Legislature adhered to the established funding formula for institutional budgets, including an inflationary adjustment. However, due to budgetary constraints, the higher education inflationary rate of 5% was not adopted. Instead, a 0.25% adjustment was approved.

She discussed increases on the employer side of the Public Employees Insurance Agency (PEIA). Dr. Tucker spoke to the fiscal impact of these changes, noting that the cumulative cost to institutions is approximately \$500,000 over the past three years. She also shared that Governor Morrissey has expressed interest in convening a special session to further examine the future impact of PEIA changes.

Dr. Tucker reported that the West Virginia Invests Grant Program experienced a \$2 million reduction, justified by a reserve balance intended to offset the shortfall. She emphasized the importance of the program and indicated that a request will be made during the next legislative session to restore the \$2 million to the program's budget.

The STAND apprenticeship program also faced budget adjustments. This initiative, designed to allow skilled trades students to complete an associate degree through one of the state's community and technical colleges, was authorized last year without funding. This year, the Legislature allocated \$1 million to support its implementation.

Dr. Tucker discussed the passage of the Board of Governors bill, which primarily targets West Virginia University and West Virginia State University but carries implications for all public institutions. The legislation removes voting rights for constituent board members—including faculty, staff, and students—at both two- and four-year institutions. These members will retain their positions but will now serve in a non-voting capacity.

The final bill discussed was the 60+60 Transfer bill. This legislation establishes a seamless transfer pathway for students at a community or technical college to continue their education at a four-year institution within the state. The pathways will be specific to programs that are academically appropriate. The bill also extends to dual enrollment students in high school, allowing for smoother transitions into the state's community and technical colleges.

### **Council Member Comments**

Council Member Elizabeth Manuel raised questions regarding the Med-Care Training Center's LPN to RN Bridge Associate Degree Program. She inquired whether market demand and potential overlap with existing programs at Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College had been assessed. Additionally, she sought clarification on whether the region has sufficient clinical placement capacity to accommodate the program's proposed enrollment of 20 students.

**There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.**

**BACKGROUND:**

West Virginia Code defines the power and duties of the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education (Council). One such power is to review and approve institutional budgets - §18B-2B-6(d)(5) *Development of budget and allocation of resources for institutions delivering community and technical college education, including reviewing and approving institutional operating and capital budgets and distributing incentive and performance-based funding.*

Budgets for Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 were prepared using a slightly different format than prior years to make comparison across the system consistent. The budgets include operating and nonoperating budgets, as well as a budget for capital projects.

A cash balance analysis is also included for the current year to provide an analysis of the institutions' cash reserves. Cash balances as of March 31 of the previous and current year as well as the year end cash balances for both years are provided.

Based upon the review by Council staff, staff recommends approval of these budgets.

**RECOMMENDED RESOLUTION:** *Resolved*, That the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education approves the Higher Education Resource Assessment (HERA) for Fiscal Year 2026 to the community and technical colleges as shown in Table 1 of the agenda item.

**STAFF MEMBER:** Misty Price

**BACKGROUND:**

West Virginia Code §18B-10-2 provides for the WV Council for Community and Technical College Education (Council) to establish a Higher Education Resource Assessment (HERA). The Council and Higher Education Policy Commission are to use funds generated through the assessment to meet general operating expenses, fund statewide programs, and to “offset the impact, if any, on financially needy students of any potential assessment increase” (West Virginia Code 18B-10-2(d)).

The passage of Senate Bill 448 in 2004, allowed the Council to adopt a procedure for assessing community and technical colleges at a fixed percentage of 1.5% of their prior year estimated gross tuition and required fees. The procedure minimizes annual changes in allocations by institution and is predictable for budgeting purposes. Council staff recommend continuing this assessment procedure for Fiscal Year (FY) 2026.

Table 1 shows the calculation of the HERA assessment at 1.5% of estimated gross tuition and required fees for each institution. The total FY 2026 assessment is \$762,187 – an increase of \$103,073 over the FY 2025 assessment of \$659,114. The net change is primarily due to an increase in tuition and fee rates from FY2024-2025. Staff recommends that HERA revenue be dedicated to statewide initiatives.

The recommendation is to approve the Higher Education Resource Assessment as presented.

**BACKGROUND:**

West Virginia Code §18B-10-1 (k)(1) requires the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education (Council) to approve any resident tuition and fee increase greater than ten percent in any one year or where the increase would be more than seven percent per year, averaged over a rolling three-year period calculated by averaging the proposed increase with the increase for the immediate two previous years. Further, the 2024 legislative rule Series 32, *Tuition and Fees*, clarifies the process the Council will use to:

- a) Review supplemental and program fees; and,
- b) Review non-resident tuition rates.

Senate Bill 335 that was passed during the 2021 legislative session expanded the West Virginia Invests Grant to include academic program fees. The legislation requires all academic program fees charged in addition to base tuition to be approved by the Council to be eligible for the West Virginia Invests.

The resident tuition and fee increases for all institutions were below the threshold required for Council approval.

The Higher Education Price Index inflation rate was 3.4 percent for 2024. Tuition and fee data are provided in the following tables.

**Table 1** reflects:

- a) Summary of the proposed academic year (AY) 2025-26 resident tuition and fee increases for all institutions.
- b) Revenue projections for resident fee increases using AY 2023-24 resident Annualized Full-Time Equivalent (AFTE) enrollment; and,
- c) Institutions' state appropriation increased 2.4% on average over the FY 2025 budget.

**Table 2** reflects:

- a) Tuition and fees breakdown between Education and General (operating funds), Auxiliary; and,
- b) Capital Fees for both proposed resident and non-resident tuition and fees.



**Table 3** reflects each institution's rate of student financial aid participation for academic year 2023-24.

**Table 4** reflects the changes in general revenue funding for FY 2025-26.

**Table 5** includes the FY 2025 calculated education and general tuition and fees revenue using AFTEs plus the FY 2026 general revenue.

**Table 6** reflects the last six years of tuition and fee increases, the five-year average annual increases, and the total dollar increase over the past five years.

### **REVIEW OF NON-RESIDENT AND REDUCED NON-RESIDENT (METRO) FEES**

#### **Table 7 – Full Cost of Instruction Calculation:**

In accordance with Series 32, Council staff performed a review of non-resident and reduced non-resident (metro) tuition and fees for each institution. This review consisted of calculating the cost of instruction per AFTE using FY 2024 audited financial data. In addition, staff reviewed the non-resident and reduced non-resident (metro) tuition and fees for AY 2024-25 to ensure that none were below the lesser of the institution's cost of instruction per AFTE or the System average. All preliminary non-resident and reduced non-resident tuition rates that were not above either the minimum of the institution's specific instructional costs per AFTE or the System average were evaluated and resolved accordingly.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Higher Education Student Financial Aid Advisory Board is a body statutorily charged to provide financial aid expertise and policy guidance to the Higher Education Policy Commission and the Council for Community and Technical College Education on matters related to federal, state, and private student financial aid resources and programs.

The Higher Education Student Financial Aid Advisory Board consists of seven members. Three members are appointed by the Commission, two members by the Council, one member by the West Virginia Independent Colleges and Universities, and one member by the West Virginia School Counselor Association. According to statute, although original appointments by the Council were for different term lengths, subsequent appointments shall be for three-year terms. Members are eligible to succeed themselves for one additional consecutive term.

The statute provides that members appointed by the Council shall possess a broad knowledge of state and federal higher education student financial aid programs and have experience in administering these programs, preferably at the system or campus level.

The Council approves membership on this Board. Currently, there is a vacant position where a board member has served the maximum amount of time allowed. Anna Crawford has been recommended and is able to serve a three-year term that begins July 1, 2025. Anna Crawford is the Assistant Dean of Financial Aid & Records at Blue Ridge Community and Technical College.

BASIC GUIDELINES AND STANDARDS FOR ADMISSIONS AND PLACEMENTS AT  
COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGES**

**§135-23-1. General.**

1.1. Scope. -- This rule establishes basic guidelines and standards for institutional admissions policies for community and technical colleges.

1.2. Authority. -- W. Va. Code §§18B-1-1A; 18B-2B-6; 18B-3C-2.

1.3. Filing Date. -- ~~February 11, 2015.~~

1.4. Effective Date. -- ~~March 13, 2015.~~

**§135-23-2. Statement of Principles.**

2.1. It is the intent of the Council for Community and Technical College Education (Council) that West Virginia residents have access to higher education opportunities commensurate with their interests and abilities. Working toward this end, the Council continues to encourage the development of academic programs which allow citizens throughout West Virginia to develop to the fullest, their capabilities for work and fulfillment of life. It is further the intent of the Council that admissions policies at the state-supported community and technical colleges ~~should~~ will foster the attainment of these broad goals of access to the highest extent possible within the limits of available education programs and resources.

2.2. In recognition of the diverse education programs offered by the different community and technical colleges, the Council considers it more appropriate to establish basic statewide guidelines and standards than to provide detailed provisions related to admissions criteria and procedures. Accordingly, the Council has identified certain basic guidelines and standards around which the community and technical colleges shall develop specific institutional admissions policies and practices ~~are to be developed.~~

2.3. This rule provides West Virginia community and technical colleges the parameters for establishing institutional procedures for the placement of students into required mathematics and English courses that can be applied toward an undergraduate academic certificate or degree.

2.4. The standards for new student assessment and placement are likewise designed to establish uniform procedures for the placement of students into required mathematics and English courses that can be applied toward an undergraduate academic certificate or degree at each institution.

2.5. Full or part-time students identified as requiring remediation must enroll in any required co-requisite courses or other entry-level college courses with supplementary academic support during the first 30 credits of enrollment. Exemptions to this policy can only be made by an institution's dean or designee.

**§135-23-3. Basic Admissions Standards.**



3.1. As a means of ~~ensuring a reasonable chance of~~ promoting student success in the postsecondary education programs for which students seek admission and of making the most productive use of effectively utilizing federal, state and community resources, institutional admissions policies shall incorporate ~~the following basic standards~~ these guiding principles.

3.1.a1. Admission to community and technical colleges is open to any person age ~~eighteen~~ 18 or older and able to benefit from post-secondary study at the community college level.

3.1.b2. Those who ~~possess~~ have earned a high school diploma recognized by a state department of education or who have earned an appropriate high school equivalency assessment credential may enroll as certificate ~~degree~~ or associate degree-seeking students.

3.1.c3. ~~Other persons~~ Students without a high school diploma or recognized equivalency may enroll as certificate ~~degree~~ or associate degree-seeking students on an ~~Ability to bBenefit~~ Ability to bBenefit basis ~~but shall be regularly evaluated~~ with regular evaluations to ensure continued academic success to determine whether their performance indicates an ability to continue their studies.

3.1.d4. Students seeking transfer admission or readmission ~~to a community and technical college~~ must meet the institution's basic admission standards.

3.1.e5. Early admissions standards for high school students enrolling in community and technical colleges are subject to the requirements of Section 135-19-6 of 135CSR19, Guidelines for Offering Early Enrollment Courses for High School Students.

3.2. Copies of high school transcripts, health records and transcripts of previous college work are not required for admission to community and technical colleges. Participation in certain federal, state, and/or institutional financial aid programs or admission to specific academic programs do require that copies of high school transcripts, satisfactory scores earned on a nationally recognized high school equivalency test and/or prior college work be provided. Individuals are encouraged to check with the appropriate institutional officials to determine the documents required for participation in, or admission to such programs.

#### **§135-23-4. Multiple Measures Placement Criteria.**

4.1. Multiple Measures is a strategy whereby community and technical colleges incorporate two or more criteria for placement. Under a multiple measures approach, standardized testing is no longer the sole means of determining if a student is prepared for college-level coursework.

4.2. Official high school transcripts, an official High School Equivalency Diploma, or Council approved high school equivalency test scores are required to be on file for each incoming student who is registered in an undergraduate degree program. Such documents shall be on file with the institution prior to the end of the first semester of the student's attendance.

4.3. The institution issuing the diploma can be validated by a College Entrance Examination Board (CEEB) code, by a state department of education, or by other established procedures determined by the institution.

4.4. Institutions may use, but shall not be limited to, the use of, the following information in determining placement:

4.4.1. Records of traditional academic performance relative to the specific educational program to which the student seeks entry.

4.4.2. Record of nontraditional learning experiences.

4.4.3. Standardized examinations relative to the requirements of the program to which the student seeks entry.

4.4.4. College equivalency examinations such as the College Level Examination Program (CLEP), special preparatory programs such as the Advanced Placement Program of the College Entrance Examination Board, and the International Baccalaureate Diploma.

4.4.5. Recommendations and reports of interviews.

**§135-23-5. Co-requisite Course Requirements.**

5.1. Co-requisite courses are credit-bearing courses that provide aligned academic support for basic and required English or mathematics courses. These co-requisite course(s) are a required component of the academic course(s). Co-requisite courses are designed for students who do not meet placement requirements for a required mathematics or English course. In these co-requisite courses, the content is the same as the traditional credit-bearing course, but students are obligated to attend and participate in the academic support programs provided. Student attendance and participation is required to successfully complete the course.

5.2. Academic Support Programs are provided to help students overcome challenges and succeed in their academic pursuits. Programs encompass a broad array of educational strategies that include, but are not limited to, modular course delivery; summer boot camps; extra class sessions; accelerated learning program (ALP) model; supplemental instruction; additional lab instruction; tutoring; and/or other instructional strategies which provide additional in-class or outside-class assistance and monitoring of student progress beyond that usually associated with entry-level college credit courses.

**§135-23-46. Institutional Admissions Policies.**

46.1. Institutional admissions policies shall specify the basic admissions requirements of the institution as well as any requirements for entry into specific programs and ~~participation in~~ financial aid programs eligibility.

46.2. All institutional admissions policies shall be consistent with the “open admissions” philosophy of the comprehensive community college.

46.3. All institutional admissions policies shall be consistent with existing Council policies and applicable State and Federal regulations regarding nondiscrimination.

46.4. All institutional admissions policies shall be submitted to the Council for evaluation in terms of their compatibility with stated Council policies. Any amendments to admission policies shall be submitted to the Council prior to their actual implementation at the institutional level.

**BACKGROUND:** Joseph Jenkins

The Skilled Trades Apprenticeship Nontraditional Degree (STAND) Program was created through the passage of House Bill 5435 during the 2024 Regular Session of the West Virginia Legislature. Codified in W. Va. Code §18B-3D-7, the STAND Program is designed to integrate classroom-based general education coursework with federally registered apprenticeship training, enabling eligible apprentices and apprenticeship certificate holders to earn Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degrees from a West Virginia public community and technical college.

The legislation directs the Council to develop and administer the program, allowing public community and technical colleges to deliver up to 15 credit hours of general education courses to eligible participants. These courses must align with the general education requirements of an A.A.S. degree and must be offered at no cost to the student. The program provides a bridge between technical training and post-secondary credentials,

supporting workforce development goals by recognizing the value of apprenticeship experience within higher education pathways.

Although the program was authorized in 2024, no funding was provided at that time. In 2025, the Legislature appropriated \$1.03 million to the Council to support program implementation and the cost of tuition and fees for participating students.

Pursuant to the legislative directive, Council staff have developed Series 28, a new rule that establishes the policies and procedures for administering the STAND Program. The rule outlines eligibility criteria for students and institutions, cost coverage limitations, payment and reporting procedures, and audit requirements.

Council staff recommend that the Council approve both the Emergency Rule and the Legislative Rule versions of Series 28 as part of this agenda item. If the legislative rule is approved, it will be filed with the West Virginia Secretary of State and subject to a 30-day public comment period. Provided no substantive comments are received during that time, the rule will then be forwarded to the Legislative Oversight Commission on Education Accountability (LOCEA) for approval and subsequent legislative action during the 2026 Regular Session.

Approval of both versions at this time ensures that the STAND Program may be implemented promptly while simultaneously complying with the full legislative rulemaking process.

4.1.1. Be a citizen or legal resident of the United States who meets the residency requirements for federal student aid;

4.1.2. Have been a resident of West Virginia for at least one year immediately preceding the date of application;

4.1.3. Be at least 18 years of age;

4.1.4. Have earned a high school diploma or passed a state-approved high school equivalency exam;

4.1.5. Be currently enrolled in a registered apprenticeship program recognized by the United States Department of Labor's Office of Apprenticeship, or hold a Certificate of Completion of Apprenticeship issued by the U.S. Department of Labor;

4.1.6. Submit a completed STAND Program application and any additional documentation required by the Council or participating institution;

4.1.7. Be accepted for enrollment into a participating community and technical college and meet the institution's standards for admission and Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP);

4.1.8. Prior to the beginning of the academic year or initial term of enrollment, complete any administrative forms or disclosures required by the Council, including a student agreement acknowledging program requirements and time limits.

4.2. Eligible students must be enrolled in one or more general education courses applicable to an associate of applied science degree program approved by the participating institution.

4.3. STAND Program participants must complete and pass all general education coursework:

4.3.1. Within six (6) years from the initial date of enrollment in the STAND Program; or

4.3.2. Within two (2) years following the completion of the apprenticeship program, whichever period is longer for apprentices;

4.3.3. For apprenticeship certificate holders, within six (6) years from the initial date of enrollment.

4.4. Prior to the conferral of an associate degree under the STAND Program, the participating institution must verify that the student-apprentice has completed a sufficient number of credit hours through coursework delivered directly by the conferring institution to satisfy institutional residency requirements established by the institution's regional accrediting body. Such credits may not be awarded through prior learning assessment or credit transfer.

4.5. Students must maintain compliance with all institutional and Council policies, including program participation requirements, course attendance, and academic performance standards.

4.6. Students may be simultaneously enrolled in both a participating community and technical college and a registered apprenticeship program. Institutions may award academic credit through a Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) process for eligible apprenticeship-related learning outcomes, even if the apprenticeship experience occurs concurrently with college enrollment. Such credit:

4.6.1. May be applied only to the technical or program-specific components of the associate degree plan;

4.6.2. May not be used to satisfy general education requirements for the degree;

4.6.3. Must be documented in accordance with institutional policy; and

4.6.4. Must meet accreditor requirements for transparency, academic rigor, and student learning assessment.

4.7. Each eligible student may receive STAND Program funding for general education coursework until whichever of the following occurs first or with fewer credit hours:

4.7.1. The student has completed twenty-one (21) credit hours of general education coursework funded through the STAND Program over the student's lifetime, regardless of the number of institutions attended or degree programs pursued; or

4.7.2. The student has met all general education requirements for an associate degree at the host institution.

### **§135-28-5. Tuition and Fees.**

5.1. Tuition and eligible academic fees for courses completed as part of the STAND Program shall be paid directly by the Council to the participating institution, subject to available appropriations.

5.2. Participating institutions shall not charge student-apprentices or apprenticeship certificate holders enrolled in the STAND Program any additional tuition, mandatory institutional fees, or academic course fees for eligible coursework covered under the program.

5.3. The rate of tuition and fees charged to the Council for courses funded through the STAND Program must be the same as the rates charged to all other students enrolled in the same or similar courses at the institution.

5.4. Institutions may not establish special tuition or fee structures for STAND Program participants that differ from those published in the institution's approved schedule of tuition and fees, unless expressly approved in writing by the Chancellor.

5.5. Fees eligible for reimbursement under the STAND Program shall be limited to:

5.5.1. Tuition;

5.5.2. Course- or program-specific academic fees approved by the Council (e.g., lab or testing fees);  
and

5.5.3. Other academic charges required of all students enrolled in the same course or program that are considered eligible for funding through the West Virginia Invests Grant program.

5.6. Fees that are not eligible for reimbursement include:

5.6.1. Tools, uniforms, textbooks, or other consumable supplies;

5.6.2. Parking, late registration, or student activity fees;

5.6.3. Any other fee deemed ineligible for funding through the West Virginia Invests Grant program;  
and

5.6.4. Any costs associated with the apprenticeship component of the program, including on-the-job training expenses.

5.7. Participating institutions shall submit documentation of tuition and fee rates, course enrollments, and verification of student participation in the STAND Program in a format and timeline prescribed by the Chancellor.

### **§135-28-6. Awards and Payment.**

6.1. Subject to available appropriations, the Council shall pay directly to eligible institutions the tuition and academic fees incurred by student-apprentices for eligible courses, the process for which shall be determined by the Chancellor.

6.4. Excess STAND funds shall not be refunded to the student.

#### **§135-28-7. Program Delivery.**

**§135-40-2. General Policy.**

2.1. It shall be the policy of the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education (Council) to provide equal employment opportunities to all qualified employees and applicants and to prohibit discrimination or harassment against any such individuals on the basis of protected characteristics. The Council considers ethnicity, marital status, race, color, religion, sex/gender, national origin, age, disability, genetic information, ~~sexual orientation, gender identity~~ and veteran status as protected characteristics and will not permit discrimination or harassment against any employee or applicant for employment on the basis of any such characteristic. ~~1.1. Scope. — The West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education (Council) consistent with provisions of West Virginia Code §18B-2B-6, adopts the procedures and guidelines for the administration of the Tech Scholars Scholarship Program.~~

~~1.2. Authority. — West Virginia Code §18B-2B-6~~

**~~§135-33-2. — Purpose.~~**

~~2.1. — The purpose of this rule is to set forth provisions for the administration of grant funding, the application process, the determination and awarding of grants, and the performance evaluation criteria for the Tech Scholars Scholarship Program. The purpose of the Tech Scholars Scholarship Program is to strengthen the quality of the State's technical workforce by providing scholarship funding to attract and graduate more students from applied technology programs that lead to employment in high-demand, high-wage occupations.~~

**~~§135-33-3. — Grant Eligibility.~~**

~~3.1. — Under the provisions of this policy, community and technical colleges, and any other institution so designated by West Virginia Code as a community and technical college, are eligible to apply for grant funding to support the Tech Scholars Scholarship Program.~~

~~3.2. — To be eligible for a grant under this policy, a community and technical college must:~~

~~3.2.a. — Have a compact approved by the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education (Council);~~

~~3.2.b. — Include strategies in the institutional compact to improve the quality of the workforce in the geographic region served by the college; and~~

~~3.2.c. — Agree to all terms, conditions and deliverables as specified in the application for proposal and this policy.~~

#### **~~§135-33-4. Program Provisions.~~**

~~4.1. Under these provisions, eligible community and technical colleges may partner with employers to provide funding for the Tech Scholars Scholarship Program that provides opportunities for students to enroll and graduate from applied technology programs that, at a minimum, meet the following:~~

~~4.1.a. Must be applied technology programs in which documentation can be provided to validate the program prepares students for employment in high-demand, high-wage occupations that have a beginning salary not less than \$12.00 per hour and progressing upward over a three-year period and have documented evidence of high-demand for new employees; and~~

~~4.1.b. Must lead to an industry recognized credential, a Certificate in Applied Science, an Associate in Applied Science, and on a selected basis an Associate in Science in an applied technology program.~~

~~4.2. To be eligible to receive funding to provide scholarships under this program, a community and technical college must have commitments from employers or other private sources to match dollar for dollar the grant amount requested. In-kind contributions are not permitted to meet the dollar match requirements, and the grant shall not be used to match donations to the general scholarship fund.~~

~~4.3. Funding from the grant must be directed to providing scholarships for a specific applied technology program or programs.~~

~~4.4. Funding provided by private donors may fund scholarships for non-resident students, and state funding shall be used to fund scholarships for resident students only. Resident students are those meeting the college's criteria for classification as an in-state resident.~~

~~4.5. Community and technical colleges shall develop criteria for awarding Tech Scholar scholarships that include but are not limited to student eligibility, amount of the award, time period, and requirements for retaining the scholarship.~~

#### **~~§135-33-5. Grant Application.~~**

~~5.1. The Chancellor of the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education shall provide grant applications to all eligible institutions with any stated deadline for submission.~~

~~5.2. The Chancellor shall appoint a review committee comprised of Council staff and/or other appropriate individuals to review grant applications and make recommendations to the Council for funding.~~

~~5.2.a. To expedite the grant approval process, the Council may delegate to the Chancellor the authority to act upon the review committee's recommendations and report to the Council those actions at the next scheduled meeting of the Council.~~

~~5.3.— Each proposal for Tech Scholars scholarship grant funding shall:~~

~~5.3.a. Identify the specific applied technology program or programs to receive scholarship funding~~

~~5.3.b. Specify goals to be achieved through scholarship funding~~

~~5.3.c. Specify criteria to be used to award scholarships~~

~~5.3.d. Identify the specific amount of funding being requested~~

~~5.3.e. Identify employer partners or other private sources providing funding for the dollar-for-dollar match requirement~~

~~5.3.f. Provide letters of commitment from employer partners or private donors indicating specific funding amounts committed for scholarships~~

~~5.3.g. Provide letters from employers indicating a need exists for graduates of the applied technology programs being impacted and the extent of the need, the beginning wage of graduates and the potential wage earnings after three years of employment~~

~~5.3.h. Identify the number of students to receive scholarships, the anticipated amount for each award and the duration of the scholarship.~~

~~5.3.i. Provide program data including but not limited to the current enrollment, number of graduates over the past five years, if applicable, fall-to-fall retention rates and job placement rates of graduates for the impacted applied technology programs.~~

#### **~~§135-33-6.— Accountability and Reporting Requirements.~~**

~~6.1.— The community and technical college receiving a grant under the provisions of the Tech Scholars Program shall submit to the Chancellor all requested accountability data and budgetary reports including but not limited to:~~

~~6.1.a. Annual and final reports detailing program expenditures;~~

~~6.1.b. A final report on goals achieved, number of students served, number of program completers, number of completers placed in employment and other information deemed necessary by the Council to evaluate the performance of the scholarship program.~~

**SECTION 1** ~~GENERAL~~

- 1.1 ~~Scope~~ This rule establishes the guidelines for the Commission and the institutions, individually or cooperatively, to maximize their use of bulk purchasing, reverse bidding, electronic market places and electronic remitting in the acquisition or procurement of materials, supplies, equipment and services.
- 1.2 ~~Authority~~ West Virginia Code §18B-5-9, §18B-17-6(b).
- 1.3 ~~Filing Date:~~ September 14, 2011
- 1.4 ~~Effective Date:~~ September 14, 2011

**SECTION 2** ~~DEFINITIONS~~

- 2.1 ~~As used in this rule, all terms have the same meaning as provided in West Virginia Code §18B-1-2, and as follows:~~
- 2.1.1. ~~"Bid" means an offer to perform a contract for service, work and labor, or the supplying of goods, materials, equipment or printing at a specified price in accordance with the specifications in a request for bids.~~
- 2.1.2. ~~"Bidder" means one who makes a bid.~~
- 2.1.3. ~~"Bulk purchasing" means the acquisition or procurement of materials, supplies, equipment, services and printing in quantity in order to benefit from the most favorable terms, prices and economies of scale.~~
- 2.1.4. ~~"Buyer" means an individual designated by a chief procurement officer to perform designated purchasing and acquisition functions as authorized by the chief procurement officer.~~
- 2.1.5. ~~"Chancellor" means the chief executive officer of the Commission employed pursuant to W. Va. Code §18B-1B-5.~~

- ~~2.1.6. "Chief procurement officer" means the individual designated by a president of a state institution of higher education to manage, oversee and direct the purchasing, acquisition and inventory management of materials, supplies, equipment, services, and printing, and disposal of obsolete and surplus materials, supplies, and equipment for that institution. For the Commission's Office and West Virginia Network for Educational Telecomputing, the chief procurement officer is the person designated by the Chancellor.~~
- ~~2.1.7. "Commission Office" means the office that houses the Chancellor, Vice Chancellor for Administration and other Commission staff.~~
- ~~2.1.8. "Commodity" means an article which is useful or serviceable, particularly an article of merchandise movable in trade; a good, or service of any kind, including construction; an article of trade or commerce; things that are bought and sold.~~
- ~~2.1.9. "Competitive bidding" means bids that are submitted in response to an invitation, public notice or advertisement of an intended sale or purchase.~~
- ~~2.1.10. "Electronic marketplaces" means an environment in which participating buyers and sellers exchange information about prices and product offerings and the procurement and payment process is conducted primarily via the Internet and websites of both the buyers and sellers.~~
- ~~2.1.11. "Electronic remitting" means to send or transmit documents, information or money (as in the transfer of funds or for payment of goods and services) by means of computer, telephone or electronic instrument from the originator to the recipient.~~
- ~~2.1.12. "Essential service" means something basic; a commodity that is necessary, indispensable, or unavoidable and is purchased in a routine, repetitive, and noncompetitive manner.~~
- ~~2.1.13. "F.O.B. destination" and "free on board destination" mean the seller or vendor must transport or pay for the transportation of the materials, supplies, equipment, services and printing, to the point of destination specified in the contract.~~
- ~~2.1.14. "Governing Boards" or "Boards" means the institutional boards of governors created pursuant to West Virginia Code §18B-2A-1(b).~~
- ~~2.1.15. "Institution(s)" means any public West Virginia university, college, community and technical college, individually or collectively, created~~

~~pursuant to West Virginia Code §18B-1-2. For the purposes of this rule, the Commission's Office and West Virginia Network for Educational Telecomputing shall also be considered institutions.~~

~~2.1.16. "President" means the executive officer of an institution.~~

~~2.1.17. "Sole source" means only one vendor can supply the desired product or service.~~

~~2.1.18. "Single source" means that the desired product or service is available from only one supplier because of the uniqueness and characteristics of the product or service offered.~~

~~2.1.19. "Responsible bidder" and "responsible vendor" mean a person and/or vendor who have the capability in all respects to perform contract requirements, and the integrity and reliability that will assure good faith performance.~~

~~2.1.20. "Responsive bidder" and "responsive vendor" mean a person and/or vendor who have submitted a bid that conforms in all material respects to the invitation to bid.~~

~~2.1.21. "Reverse Bidding" means (1) an offer by an intended purchaser to a seller to pay a designated price for the specified material, supplies, equipment, services and printing; (2) the buyer uses the electronic marketplace to set a date and time for interested vendors to bid on certain commodities, an opening bid is made, and other vendors follow by bidding downward until no one chooses to sell to the buyer at a lower price.~~

~~2.1.22. "Sealed bid" means bid submitted under seal, and which is not to be opened until a specified time at which all bids are to be opened and compared.~~

~~2.1.23. "Vendor" means a seller of goods and services.~~

~~2.1.24. "West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education" or "Council" means the Council created pursuant to West Virginia Code §18B-2B-1 et seq.~~

~~2.1.25. "Vice Chancellor for Administration" means that person employed by the Chancellor in accordance with West Virginia Code §18B-4-2. The Vice Chancellor for Administration shall assume all powers and duties that were assigned to the Senior Administrator.~~



### **SECTION 3 ————— APPLICABILITY**

~~3.1 This rule applies to all institutions as defined in Section 2.~~

### **SECTION 4 ————— PURCHASE OR ACQUISITION OF MATERIALS, SUPPLIES, EQUIPMENT, SERVICES, CONSTRUCTION AND PRINTING**

~~4.1 As provided by this rule, the Commission and institutions may institute the following purchasing practices either individually or cooperatively for purchase or acquisition of materials, supplies, equipment, services and printing.~~

~~4.2 Bulk Purchasing:~~

~~4.2.1. The Commission shall establish a working committee consisting of Commission staff and institutional representatives to identify the materials, supplies, equipment, services and printing that may reasonably be purchased in bulk to take advantage of economies of scale. In compiling this list and in assessing the economic advantage of purchasing a commodity or service in bulk, the committee shall consider the acquisition cost of the commodity or service, included but not limited to, delivery costs, handling and storage costs, timing of purchases and customer satisfaction. This committee shall also monitor and report to the Chancellor from time to time on any cost savings and efficiencies realized from bulk purchasing.~~

~~4.2.2. Bulk purchase contracts may be bid and entered into by either the Commission or an institution on behalf of all institutions. Once issued, the Commission and all institutions participating in the contract shall use it as the primary source of procurement of the commodities or services provided in the contract. The Chief Procurement Officer may authorize purchases off the contract if it is deemed to be in the best interests of the Commission or institution to do so. If an institution decides not to participate in a bulk purchase contract, the institution's Chief Procurement Officer shall state in writing the reason(s) for not participating and the cost savings resulting therefrom.~~

~~4.3 Reverse Bidding:~~

~~4.3.1. The Commission shall establish a working committee consisting of representatives from the Commission staff and institutions to implement reverse bidding for all public higher education institutions within the State. The working group shall review currently accepted reverse bidding practices within both corporate America and higher education to determine what is most appropriate to West Virginia higher education. Software and other enabling media shall also be investigated. Recommendations shall be made in a timely manner by~~

~~the group which addresses commodities to be purchased through reverse bidding, software and enabling media, implementation procedures, and time lines to effect reverse bidding within higher education in the State.~~

#### ~~4.4 Electronic Marketplaces:~~

~~4.4.1. Electronic marketplaces, also know as e-procurement, will allow the Commission and the institutions to buy or sell goods and services in a digital environment. This procurement method takes advantage of combined purchasing power, improved processes and will allow better utilization of automated systems. It will also integrate higher education buyers directly into the market place, aide in sharing best business practices and assist buyers in gaining control and thus strengthen vendor relationships, gaining access to tracking mechanics which will provide the ability to tract and report hard dollar savings.~~

~~4.4.2. This method of purchasing is relatively new and it will require research and planned implementation before the Commission and the institutions can take full advantage of it as a common purchasing method. As a result, a committee of Commission and institution staff will be formed to develop this method as a viable alternative to other procurement methods, plan its implementation and identify the goods and services that may be most effectively acquired using this method. Once these tasks are accomplished, this method may be employed in the acquisition of goods and services.~~

#### ~~4.5 Electronic Remitting:~~

~~4.5.1. The Commission and the institutions may utilize electronic remitting in the course of transacting business with vendors, other private entities, state agencies and governmental units. This includes but is not limited to:~~

- ~~(a) Remitting payment for goods and services electronically to vendors.~~
- ~~(b) Electronically performing the processes and providing documents to the Attorney General, State Auditor, the Department of Administration and other governmental agencies which are required by W. Va. Code and normal business practices.~~

~~4.5.2. A committee composed of Commission staff and institutional representatives shall work with the State Auditor to implement, by December 31, 2003, an easy to use, cost effective and efficient~~

~~program to electronically remit payment for goods, services, utilities, etc. to vendors and providers.~~

~~4.5.3. In order to gain efficiencies and economy of operation the following processes required by W. Va. Code may be performed electronically using existing technology, software and procedures:~~

- ~~(a) Encumbrance: Purchases exceeding the dollar amount identified in W. Va. Code §18B-5-4(a)(5), for purchases by sealed bids and competitive bidding, may be directly and electronically entered into the state's centralized accounting system by the staff of the Commission or the governing boards to satisfy the requirements of article two, chapter five-a, and more specifically, sections twenty-six, twenty-seven and twenty-eight to determine whether the amount of the purchase is within the Commission's or governing board's quarterly allotment, is in accordance with the approved expenditure schedule, and otherwise conforms to the provisions of article two, chapter five-a. The electronic entry shall be in lieu of any hard copy or paper submission. Purchases not exceeding the dollar amount in W. Va. Code §18B-5-4(a)(5) do not require encumbrance and shall be accounted for and liquidated in the state's centralized accounting system through the payment process.~~
- ~~(b) Filing contracts with the State Auditor: The Commission and the institutions may file contracts with the State Auditor as required by W. Va. Code §18B-5-4(i) electronically or may make these contracts available to the State Auditor by any other acceptable means.~~

~~— 1.1. Scope. Rule establishing process and guidelines for institutions to adopt rules governing the selection, adoption, use and sale of textbooks and other course materials.~~

~~— 1.2. Authority. W. Va. Code §§18B-1B-4; 18B-10-14.~~

~~— 1.3. Filing Date. April 22, 2010.~~

~~— 1.4. Effective Date. May 22, 2010.~~

**~~§135-51-2. Purpose.~~**

~~— 2.1. To require institutions to promulgate rules that fully and adequately address the mandates in W. Va. Code §18B-10-14 regarding the operation of bookstores and the actions of employees of the institution in the selection and adoption of textbooks and course materials.~~

~~— 2.2. To require institutions to promulgate rules that will effectuate the mandates regarding textbooks and supplementary course materials set out by Congress in the Higher Education Opportunity Act (HEOA) enacted on August 14, 2008, and any successor to that Act.~~

~~— 2.3. To require institutions to promulgate rules addressing the recommendations of the Statewide Task Force on Textbook Affordability contained in the final report of that Task Force jointly adopted by the Higher Education Policy Commission and the Council for Community and Technical College Education (Council).~~

**~~§135-51-3. West Virginia Code Mandates.~~**

~~— 3.1. Each institutional governing board under the jurisdiction of the Council shall promulgate rules that fully and adequately address the statutory mandates of W. Va. Code §18B-10-14. Specifically, these rules shall, at a minimum:~~

~~— 3.1.a. Provide specific mechanisms to ensure that bookstores operated at institutions under the governing board's jurisdiction minimize the costs to students for textbooks and course materials. To that end, the governing board rule shall:~~

~~— 3.1.a.1. Commit, to the maximum extent practicable, to the number of used books the bookstore will repurchase from students at the end of each semester.~~

~~— 3.1.a.2. Commit, to the maximum extent practicable, a range of percentage repurchase prices based on the new textbook price.~~

~~— 3.1.a.3. Commit, to the maximum extent practicable, to a selection procedure that will ensure certain basic textbooks will be utilized for a reasonable number of consecutive years without new editions being adopted, or selection of basic textbooks where earlier editions are easily and appropriately utilized~~

~~in the courses.~~

~~3.1.b. Prohibit any employee of the governing board from receiving any payment, loan, subscription, advance, deposit or money, service benefit or thing of value, present or promised, as an inducement for requiring students to purchase a specific textbook or supplemental course materials, provided, however, that an employee may receive royalties or other compensation from such sales that include the employee's own writing or work. An employee may also receive free sample copies, instructor's copies and instructional material but may not resell those items and retain the proceeds.~~

~~3.1.c. Prohibit any employee of the governing board from requiring for any course a textbook that includes his or her own writing or workbook if the textbook incorporates either detachable worksheets or workbook style pages intended to be written in or removed from the textbook. This does not prohibit an employee from requiring as a supplement to a textbook any workbook or similar material which is published independently from the textbook.~~

~~3.1.d. Provide firm deadlines for faculty to be assigned to courses and textbooks and course materials to be selected prior to each semester.~~

~~3.1.d.1. For those deadlines, to the maximum extent practicable, not met there shall be a mechanism in place reasonably calculated to ensure that used textbooks, if available, can be located and purchased by the time of enrollment each semester to the maximum extent practicable.~~

~~3.1.d.2. This mechanism should include, but is not limited to, such measures as default selection of certain textbooks, continuing to use the previous textbook, or having a chair or dean select the textbook. Any such textbook default selection must be strictly enforced and faculty not be allowed to change the selection.~~

~~3.1.e. Provide that a listing of all selected textbooks and materials selected and assigned prior to each semester shall be prominently posted immediately after such selection process is completed and the textbook and course materials are designated for order by the bookstore:~~

~~3.1.e.1. In a central location on campus communicated to the student body;~~

~~3.1.e.2. In every campus bookstore operated at the institution;~~

~~3.1.e.3. On the institution's website; and~~

~~3.1.e.4. With the International Standard Book Number (ISBN), edition number and any other relevant information regarding each textbook or supplemental course materials.~~

~~3.1.f. Provide that by November 1 of each year, the institution shall report to the Chancellor of the Council, for the prior fiscal year, the deadlines established for faculty to be assigned to courses; the deadlines for textbooks and course materials to be selected; the percentages of those deadlines met; and the dates the listing of assigned textbooks and course materials were posted pursuant to the requirements of Section 3.1.e. of this rule.~~

~~3.1.g. Provide that all revenue the institution receives from a private entity for bookstore operation is utilized for non-athletic scholarships at the institution.~~

#### **~~§135-51-4. Federal Mandates.~~**

~~4.1. Each institutional governing board under the jurisdiction of the Council shall promulgate rules that fully and adequately address the federal mandates regarding textbooks contained in the Higher~~

Education Opportunity Act of 2008 (Public Law 110-315). Specifically, these rules shall, at a minimum:

~~4.1.a. Provide that textbook publishers soliciting any employee of the governing board to select textbooks or supplemental course material provide that employee, in writing:~~

~~4.1.a.1. The price of the textbook and supplemental course materials;~~

~~4.1.a.2. The copyright dates of the three previous editions, if any;~~

~~4.1.a.3. A description of substantial content revisions from the previous editions;~~

~~4.1.a.4. Whether the textbook is available in other lower cost formats and, if so, the price to the institution and the general public;~~

~~4.1.a.5. The price of textbooks unbundled from supplemental material; and~~

~~4.1.a.6. The same information, to the extent practicable, for custom textbooks.~~

~~4.1.b. Provide that no employee of the governing board shall select or assign a textbook or supplemental course materials if the publisher has not supplied the information, in writing, required by Section 4.1.a. of this rule.~~

~~4.1.c. Provide that the institution shall provide on its electronic course schedule, or through a link to its bookstore's website, prior to course enrollment each semester for all required or recommended textbooks and supplemental material:~~

~~4.1.c.1. The ISBN number and retail price, or if the ISBN number is not available then the author, title, publisher and copyright date;~~

~~4.1.c.2. If such disclosure is not practicable, then the designation "To Be Determined".~~

~~4.1.c.3. A reference shall be made on any written course schedule to the information available on the electronic course schedule accessible through the institutional website and the internet address for the electronic course schedule.~~

~~4.1.d. Provide that the institution will include on its website or through a link to its bookstore's website and electronic course schedule any of its policies or provisions for:~~

~~4.1.d.1. Rental of textbooks;~~

~~4.1.d.2. The purchase of used textbooks;~~

~~4.1.d.3. Textbook repurchase or buy backs; and~~

~~4.1.d.4. Alternative content delivery programs.~~

~~4.1.e. Provide that the institution will update its policies to comply with any future federal mandates.~~

#### **~~§135-51-5. Textbook Affordability Committee.~~**

~~5.1. Each institution shall establish a permanent Textbook Affordability Committee consisting of faculty, students, administrators and bookstore representatives which shall meet periodically, but at least~~

~~annually, to advise the faculty senate, student government, administration, and institutional board of governors on affordability issues and initiatives, textbook selection guidelines and strategies, and educational opportunities.~~

~~— 5.2. The governing board shall annually meet with the Textbook Affordability Committee to receive any recommendations or reports it may have generated and copies of any such recommendations and reports shall be transmitted to the Chancellor of the Council.~~

#### **~~§135-51-6. Required Provisions.~~**

~~— 6.1. In adopting the policies required by this rule each governing board shall:~~

~~— 6.1.a. Adopt guidelines for faculty in the selection of textbooks and supplementary course materials that ensure appropriate, high quality course materials are selected but give students timely access to the most affordable materials. Institutions are encouraged to consider:~~

~~— 6.1.a.1. Requiring faculty to consider more than one textbook publisher and compare prices for textbooks and course materials;~~

~~— 6.1.a.2. Requiring that all new textbook selections submitted to the appropriate dean or chair for approval be accompanied by a simple form for the faculty member to state whether or not the written information required from the publisher pursuant to Section 4.1.a. of this rule, if requested, was provided;~~

~~— 6.1.a.3. Discouraging selection of textbooks in which less than 50 percent of the content will be used in the course unless the same textbook will be utilized by the student in other courses;~~

~~— 6.1.a.4. Encouraging selection of textbooks that have low cost alternative editions available;~~

~~— 6.1.a.5. Encouraging selection of textbooks it is believed will not be revised by the publisher in the near future;~~

~~— 6.1.a.6. Utilizing consortiums which make available open source textbooks or course materials to faculty and students free or at low cost;~~

~~— 6.1.a.7. Directing an examination of the feasibility of operating a textbook rental program;~~

~~— 6.1.a.8. Providing that the institution shall conduct training for all faculty, at the time of hire and periodically thereafter, on textbook selection and strategies that guarantee high quality course materials at the most affordable cost;~~

~~— 6.1.a.9. Providing that at least one administrator at the institution shall be designated as a liaison with textbook publishers, to be responsible for dissemination of relevant information to the faculty on textbook strategies and education and training opportunities regarding textbook selection, and to enforce the policies the governing board adopts;~~

~~— 6.1.a.10. Providing that the institution, to the maximum extent practicable, consider placing a copy of required textbooks on reserve in the institutional or departmental library;~~
